BUDGET 2020

The Treasurer welcomed Council to their first 2020 Budget meeting. The Treasurer provided an outline of the 2020 preliminary budget which represents a 5.18% increase

in the amount of tax that will be collected, which translates into a 3.9% increase in the tax rate.

The Treasurer ran through the highlights of the draft budget which included changes in revenues, namely the Ontario Municipal Partnership Fund (OMPF) grant, the Federal Gas Tax Funds, Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund (OCIF) and the Grant for Public Works from the United Counties of Prescott and Russell. The Treasurer then ran through key changes in expenditures, such as major investments in roads, reallocation of salaries on paper, insurance costs; as well as significant costs borne by the accumulated surplus in 2019, and those to be paid from the Reserves in 2020. He also highlighted some key expenses for 2020, the changes to the Township's long-term debt in 2020 and the Reserves and Reserve Funds for 2020.

The Treasurer presented the proposed 2020 Capital budget summary by department, which included a number of options.

Note: There was a short break in the presentation from 2:27 p.m. to 2:36 p.m.
