The Township of Champlain has modified **page 16, Section 2.3.4 Splash Pad Shape/Colour/Finish** by ways of eliminating the requirement to have a synthetic surface on the cement pad. Should a bidder still choose to include a synthetic surface in their proposal, the Township will consider it as an added value to the Splash Pad.

The following changes are effective immediately and shall be incorporated into the Request for Proposal documents:

Delete:

2.3.4 Splash Pad Shape/Colour/Finish

Special shape for the cement pad is not required. Any special shape or colour will be considered in the evaluation. The synthetic surfacing on the concrete shall be consistent with no rough patches and be conducive to bare-foot Splash Pad users. Finished surfaces must be even, with no lips or trip edges.

Replace with:

2.3.4 *new* Splash Pad Shape/Colour/Finish

Special shape for the cement pad is not required. Any special shape or colour will be considered in the evaluation. The surfacing on the concrete shall be consistent with no rough patches and be conducive to bare-foot Splash Pad users. Finished surfaces must be even, with no lips or trip edges.

A Brief History:

In 2010, the family received a trip through Make-A-Wish as their son Sacha suffered from cerebral palsy, blindness and other cognitive delays. They visited a park in Orlando, Florida and that's where they were first introduced to the idea of a "universal playground."

Before then, Sacha was resigned to having to watch other kids play from the sidelines. But at this new playground, Sacha got to play with other kids his older brother, pushed him on the swings for the first time. When Sacha passed away, the playground remained one of the family's fondest memories and they decided to replicate it near home. They donated land to the Township and through fundraising and donations, the park came to life. Sacha's Park is the only fully accessible park in Canada where "Everyone can play".

Sacha's love of Batman shaped the creation of the park therefore all current components in the park are classic blue and yellow in colour. There's also a bat symbol on one of the swings.

The family's wish was to build a Splash Pad with a baby beluga theme, inspired by the Raffi song, which Sacha's parents say they must have sang to Sacha a moderate "85,000 times".

2.3.4 *new* Splash Pad Shape/Colour/Finish

Special shape for the cement pad is not required. Any special shape or colour will be considered in the evaluation. The surfacing on the concrete shall be consistent with no rough patches and be conducive to bare-foot Splash Pad users. Finished surfaces must be even, with no lips or trip edges.

Note: All material related to the construction of the Splash Pad must meet the Ontario Provincial Standards.

2.3.5 Options

The Proponent may submit 2 option plans for the Splash Pad.

2.4 Permits, Licenses, and Approvals

Proponents shall obtain all permits, licenses, and approvals required in connection with the supply of the Goods. The costs of obtaining such permits, licenses, and approvals shall be the responsibility of, and shall be paid for by, the Proponent.

Where a Proponent is required by Applicable Laws to hold or obtain any such permit, license, and approval to carry on an activity contemplated in its Proposal or in the Agreement, neither acceptance of the Proposal nor execution of the Agreement by the Purchaser shall be considered an approval by the Purchaser for the Proponent to carry on such activity without the requisite permit, license, or approval.

2.5 Electrical Goods

Any electrical Goods being proposed for consideration pursuant to this RFP must be authorized or approved in accordance with the Electrical Safety Code or by a certification organization accredited with the Standards Council of Canada Act (Canada), and shall bear the certification organization's mark identifying the goods certified for use in Canada. Certification shall be to the standard that is appropriate for the intended use of the electrical Goods at the Purchaser's facilities. Prior to entering into the Agreement, the Proponent shall have provided satisfactory evidence of such certification, as applicable.
